

Hall of Fame Guidelines for the Induction of a Member or Rabbit

The Hall of Fame is the highest honor that can be bestowed upon any individual member or rabbit by the ANDRC. The present qualifications for nomination are:

For Members:

1. One shall have raised the Netherland Dwarf for 10 years and should have been a member of the ANDRC for 10 years.
2. One must have served at least 2 terms as an Officer or elected Director of the ANDRC.
3. One must have been active in state and regional Dwarf Clubs.
4. One must have aided in the promotion and improvement of the Dwarf through successful breeding.
5. One must have assisted others in their efforts to raise and improve the quality of the Netherland Dwarf. One must have given of his time, knowledge, and stock to help others, particularly the beginner.
6. One must have been an exemplary showman on a local, regional, and national level. (Winning is not the only criterion here: sportsmanship, honesty, integrity, and consistency should also be considered).
7. A person may be elected posthumously without meeting the above requirements.
8. A tie vote is to be broken by the Chairman of the Hall of Fame.

For Rabbits:

1. The rabbit must have had a successful show career either regionally or nationally.
2. Longevity is an important criterion. The rabbit must have exhibited success on the show table over a period of years.
3. His or her progeny must have had a profound influence on improving the quality of the Netherland Dwarf either regionally or nationally, as is evidenced by successful show careers.

If you have a person or a rabbit that you think is a candidate, please write or email any of the Hall of Fame committee members with your recommendations. These should be in the hands of the members before May 1st of any given year.
